1) Call to Order, Welcome, Motion to pass Apr 11th, 2016 Minutes: Minutes of last meeting approved.

2) Character Education - Ms Magson, Siona, Sara

1. Laurier Locker Goals: 12 Character Ed leaders attended a Crime Stoppers Symposium; Inspired by a presenter's personal goal setting experiences, the team is developing a new initiative: Laurier Locker Goals. Studies show that with goals written down and visible, people are more likely to achieve them; Postcard sized magnets with Sir W.L.C.I. at the top and Every Day Matters (Siona's slogan) at the bottom will be distributed in the fall; students will be encouraged to set positive goals, write them down on the magnet, post them in their locker during a short in class workshop by Character Ed leaders; periodic 'goal checking' will ensue; this initiative is in line with SMART goals (Specific, Measurable, Attainable, Relevant, Time Based) with highest level of goal achievement when held accountable for them; setting goals is particularly good for young people because it results in less negative involvement and outcomes; Parent: suggested to post comments on how students are meeting their goal(s) on Laurier Blog...

3) Student Report - Emma, André

- 1. **SAC Elections**: Rashdi the new president; 3 student reps per grade; reps will be able to do more and participate more in all the activities; quite a few returning students, therefore a lot of experience
- 2. **SAC Carnival** tomorrow; in the back field; with inflatables, obstacle courses, bungee runs, photo booth, dunk tank (featuring Mr. Tenentes & Emma); 2 hour lunch; bring sunscreen
- 3. Laurier Sports: Girls' lacrosse; Boys soccer; Girls Waterpolo (semifinalists); Rugby (Jr Boys semifinalists); Baseball, Cricket
- 4. **Me2We**: fundraisers to help build a school in rural China: bake sale; basket ball game Laurier team vs teachers; car detailing; possible fun run
- 5. Mental Health and Bullying seminar: Youth Embracing Sexuality particular focus on Bullying LGBTQ and Mental Health
- 6. Music Showcase: two weeks ago

- 15. Duke of Edinburgh Club: canoe trip to Algonquin Park this week
- 16. **Guildwood Days:** Saturday, June 4th; parade closes the street for about 45 minutes; ends at the back of Laurier
- 17. **Strawberry Festival** at Poplar Rd Jr PS: June 17; may need volunteers
- 18. Commencement: Friday Nov 4th, 2016 (graduation ceremonies for those who completed their High School diploma in 2016)
- 19. **Kudos** to our **SAC leaders Emma and André:** Mr Tenentes thanked them for their participation and especially for their outstanding leadership role at Laurier. Emma represented Laurier AND Canada in *The International DECA Conference* in Tennessee; André was one of 80 Canadian **finalists** for the Loran Award (find out about the award at http://loranscholar.ca/apply/)

4) Principal's Report – Marios Tenentes

- 1. **Laurier Evacuation Plan:** shows marshalling areas; teachers know their responsibilities; students would be evacuated to Jack Miner and/or Maplewood H.S. if necessary
- 2. Guild Park and Gardens: partnership developing between school, community and city to develop the gardens

- 3. Carnival: May 31st; during extended 2 hr lunch; students have class before and after
- 4. **PROM:** at the Atlantis, Wed June 1st; heads up for next year: Prom will be at the Guild Inn as that is where Atlantis is moving
- 5. **Ward Meeting:** June 1st, 6:30-8:30; at Joseph Brant; new interim Education Director John Malloy will be speaking; information about the decentralization and 4 learning centres
- 6. Athletic Banquet: at Rembrandt Banquet Hall June 9th
- 7. **Commencement:** Friday, Nov 4th; a Brightpix photographer will return to take photos
- 8. **ELECTRONIC Waste Collection:** June 1st to June 3rd at 4 PM; in conjunction with *The Church of the Holy Trinity* and *Ontario Environmental Services* (OES); spread the news; Laurier will receive a bit of \$ per unit weight of e-waste; wipe your data clean; Mr Hirji and his students will go over 3 times a day to stack the items in the bin...
- 9. Registration for September:
 - a. Tues Aug 30th = Grades 11 and 12
 - b. Wed Aug 31st = Grade 9 only
 - c. Thurs **Sept 1**st = Grade **10** only
 - d. "Cashless" Registration: Laurier is part of TDSB's pilot for "cashless" schools; families will be able to pay the \$50 student registration fee prior to registration; students will show their receipt; this avoids students carrying a lot of cash: costs are itemized on the registration form (team costs, club costs, etc); yearbooks have been bulk ordered, cutting the cost to below half
 - e. Movin' On Up for Grade 9: activities/orientation for those entering grade 9 begins right after registration (Aug 31)
 - f. New \$50 IB Registration Fee: Fees have gone up this year, and in combination with the weak Canadian dollar, this has been a big issue; TDSB's policy has been not to charge students for the IB program, though most *other* boards require students to pay hundreds or even thousands of dollars to cover IB fees; Laurier will now be levying fees to cover *some of the cost increases* (this year, funds were taken out of the regular school budget to cover the \$20,000 IB deficit); some costs are not fixed, such as photocopying packages, mailing exams/essays to external examiners all over the world, IB University Fair and bus...; the \$50 IB Registration Fee is in addition to the regular Laurier registration fee, therefore IB students will pay a total of \$100
- 10. OSSTF Secondary Teachers' Strike continues; Administration has continued to fill in gaps and gather attendance; Teachers doing minimal on report cards; For Grade 12 students, teachers will enter the marks, as they are needed for university; For Grades 9, 10, 11 Union has told the teachers not to enter marks for these grades (using Markbook or Trillium); We are awaiting direction from TDSB how to manage this; Last year, as part of the elementary school strike, superintendents went to the schools for the first couple of weeks in the summer to fill in the report cards; parents cannot volunteer; no one is sure what or when the solution will be; Mark Return Day is when teachers can share their mark with each student; encourage students to come with a piece of paper to note down the marks; Parties have not been at the table since before winter break

5) Other Business – Angela Bernard

- 11. In May, TDSB **approved** Laurier **Pool funding for the 2016-2017 school year**. *Toronto Lands Corporation* is looking for a tenant to rent space at the pool to generate revenue to help keep the pool open on a sustainable basis
- 12. Mr Tenentes and Council thanked Angela Bernard for all her work as *School Council Chair* for the past 3 years. She is retiring due to the fact that her youngest is graduating in June
